## 54 **Putnam Pond Boat Ramp Update**

The Board just returned from a field trip to Putnam Pond Boat Ramp. Road Agent Chase will look at the regulations to verify how far down the boat ramp he can put the crushed stone. He wants to be sure how close to the water he can go before he adds any additional stone. Currently, he did not put stone close to the water's edge.

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## Rental Agreement for Roadside Mower

- After reviewing the contract, PRIMEX recommends to insert the language, "lease negligence" to cover the Town to be accountable only for any damage that is their fault. This was in the 2018 contract but the Town was informed that that language was incorrectly added by a former employee of HP Fairfield and that language change was unauthorized. The Town is uncomfortable with the language as presented in the contract and does not want to be liable for pre-existing issues. It was discussed that the liability is very high with rental companies.
- The Board discussed options which include researching other companies and having the Highway Department weed whack the worst spots and intersections. It was discussed to try to have a contractor perform the roadside mowing around the first week of September, as later in the fall would be too late in the season. In any case consider booking for June 2020.

## 2019 Emergency Generator Contract Renewal

The contract from Powers Generator has been steady for a few years but increased to
 \$1,315.00 this year. The contract includes the Central School, Highway Garage,

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## 2020 Statistical Update Discussion

The cost has increased because the assessor anticipates a lot of changes due to the statistical update and software conversion therefor it could be a contentious situation because valuations are expected to increase. The conversion regarding Avitar was also discussed and who is responsible for inputting data. It was mentioned that Advitar will input the data. The Board inquired about Avitar's fees for this service.
