#### 1. Scenic quality of structure:

# **3.** Historical importance on a local, regional or national level, individually or as part of a historic area:

(65%-75%) Structure is listed or eligible for listing, in the National Register of Historic Places; or the structures physical or aesthetic features contribute to the historic or cultural integrity of a property listed or eligible for listing in the National Register of Historic Places; or the structure is a "contributing" structure in the National Register of Historic Districts.

(55%-65%) Structure is listed or eligible for listing in the New Hampshire Register of Historic Places or the structures physical or aesthetic features contribute to the historic or cultural integrity of a property listed, or eligible for listing in the New Hampshire Register of Historic Places. (45%-55%) Structure is not listed, nor eligible for listing, in neither the National nor New Hampshire Registers, but is of state, regional, or local importance. (*Documentation required*)

(35%-45%) Structure is neither listed, nor eligible for listing, in the National nor New Hampshire Registers, nor is of state regional or local importance, but in the opinion of the Board of Selectmen significantly reinforces local or state preservation goals due to its being an unusual or rare surviving type, good example of historic construction or materials, telling the story of agriculture in the community or being part of a landscape or setting that retains its historic character.

(25%-35%) Structure is in the opinion of the Board of Selectmen not significant in the cultural history of the community.

(55%-65%) Structure is able to be restored to excellent condition and it retains its historic exterior appearance.

(35%-45%) Structure is able to be restored to excellent condition bit it may not be restored to its historic exterior appearance.

(25%-35%) Structure may not be able to be restored to excellent condition nor to its historic exterior appearance.
