She just turned 99-years old, is the current holder of the Boston Post Cane and was involved in the town. Possible cover images include; The Purple Heart signs, Putnam Pond, South Cemetery wall repair, the utility shed and events such as the Memorial Day Parade or Veteran's Day Observance.

Winter Road Maintenance Policy Review

The policy was last updated in 2016. The Board was asked to review the document and present any updates or changes at the next meeting. It was noted the Road Agent's name will need to be updated. Selectman McQuade mentioned the fire department should be added to section 9.6 and the current 9.6 moved to 9.7.

 Furnace Brook Road: Road Agent Chase wanted a directive as to when Furnace Brook Road should be closed for the winter. It was agreed to close the road on November 30 with Jersey barriers.

Winter Parking Ordinance: Selectman Douglas inquired if the Winter Parking Ordinance has been noticed in the newspaper and asked that it include the RSA regarding parking on roadways. T/A Boland stated that the RSA will be included in the advertisement.

Highway Garage Fire Alarm/Detection: The alarms are scheduled to be installed at the Highway Garage from December 2-4, 2019.

Sanders and plows: The Road Agent reported the sanders and plows are ready to go.

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Joint Meeting: T/A Boland invited the Wilton Municipal Budget Committee, Lyndeborough Municipal Budget Committee, Wilton Board of Selectmen, Wilton-Lyndeborough School Board, and Wilton-Lyndeborough Budget Committee to an informational meeting on December 3, 2019 in Lyndeborough. T/A Boland spoke in person with Matt Ballou from the School Board Budget Committee. An agenda will be developed and sent to the various Boards. The intent of the meeting is to discuss future budgets and the impact it has on the residents.

Two emails were received relative to the invitation: Matt Ballou sent an email inviting the Lyndeborough Selectmen to their meetings on November 26, 2019 at 6:30pm plus he will add Lyndeborough's invitation as an agenda item. Paul Branscombe sent an email that Wilton Selectwoman Boissonnault and Selectman Williams will attend. Leslie Brown from the WLC Budget Committee replied they plan to attend.

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Chairman Chamberlain inquired when the Board would like to meet with Sam Green from the DRA. T/A Boland will reach out to Mr. Green regarding dates for the meeting.
