29		TDS Fiber Update for Town Buildings
30		The Cable Franchise contract has been executed. The Town buildings should have fiber
31		optic cabling hooked-up by the end of the year at Citizens' Hall, the Lyndeborough Fire
32		Station, the Highway Garage, and the J.A. Tarbell Library. T/A Boland will check to see
33		if Center Hall was included in the "no fee hook-up agreement". He will also inquire about
34 35		the cost to include the EOC building on Center Road and the Old Town Barn in the Center.

37		Street Lighting Project Update
38		The Street Lighting Project is moving forward. Two checks have been issued to
39		Eversource for installing lights in locations now currently lit and for the upgrades. The
40		work could begin 21-days after the checks are issued. The lights to be taken down will
41		be delivered to the Highway Garage to be dispositioned.
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43		2020 Assessing Statistical Update Discussion
44		The contract has been updated to reflect the DRA and PRIMEX proposed changes. The
45		assessing liability insurance was increased to \$2 million. Upon review it was noticed
46		there is a numbering sequence error in the contract. The Board will review the contract
47		again. There were two letters from Sam Greene, Administrator with the Property
48		Appraisal Division of the Department of Revenue, on October 8 and October 28, 2019.

Mr. Greene would like to meet with the Selectmen in the near future regarding the topic of assessing and options. T/A Boland will set-up an appointment.

- 57 VI. Town Administrator Report

Per the Selectmen's meeting on Friday, November 1, 2019:

- -There was a 2018 journal entry of \$21,183.00 made by the auditors into the Police Department line for office supplies. \$19,998.00 was encumbered for the cruiser. The auditor selected the line the money was entered into. It was discussed that a more appropriate line should have been used, such as Cruiser Maintain.
- -The chair under Office Supplies was put under Office Equipment.
- -It was confirmed the Fire Department has used only \$384.00 in fuel so far this year.
 Their fuel budget line is \$1,250.00. Selectman McQuade wonders if the trucks are
 rolling out for less training and if they had a lower call volume. The Fire Department
 monthly report is in the file. There were 114 calls. It was also noted that when fueling, a
 slip needs to be submitted and an accurate mile count needs to be documented.
- Community Day expenses have not been submitted to the Town therefore they have not
 been reimbursed. T/A Boland reached out to the organizers.
- T/A Boland would like to get the Warrant Articles to the Selectmen for their review at the
 December 4, 2019 meeting. Department heads have been instructed to have their
 reports turned in by December 2, 2019.
- Selectman Douglas inquired if there are any costly items on the horizon other than
 Warrant Articles. T/A Boland responded that as far as he is aware, all the Warrant
 Articles are coming from the CIP such as the tanker, dump truck and an exhaust system
 for the Fire Department.
- The Town received notification that the Wilton-Lyndeborough School Board Budget Committee took a vote of no confidence in the School District's Administrative Staff, Superintended and the School Board.
- The 2020 Budget has been updated. The Selectmen will review the document. The budget will be forwarded to the Budget Committee for review prior to their first meeting on November 26, 2019.
- The Board had a brief conversation about budget cuts made at their last meeting while working from the second draft. T/A Boland will provide a document that explains what was cut or reallocated, as well as what lines were over-expended or show a surplus and why.
- The proposed Building Maintenance Warrant Article from last year was discussed and if they should reconsider proposing it again this year.
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98 99 100		Selectman McQuade asked if the culvert issue on Pettingill Hill Road has been resolved. It appears the pot holes have been filled-in, but no additional work was done. T/A Boland will look into this.
