## 12 Right of Way (ROW) for PLC

- 13 Request:
- 14 Even though the Rose Mountain property is not a valuable wood lot, and the Piscataquog Land
- 15 Conservancy (PLC) has no intention of logging the property, they would like to include Right of Way
- language in the Town Forest Easement so that they have guaranteed access in the future.

- 18 Why:
- 19 To provide access to the property which is currently land locked by other private owners. Scout road
- 20 which connects to their property is not currently passable so this is not a viable route and it would be
- 21 easier to cut a new path. There is a cleared path to the old cabin site (that we just used to remove the
- 22 cabin) that could be extended, though if logging were to take place in the future this path may also be
- 23 compromised.

- How would this be helpful to the town?:
- Surplus money that was earmarked for the Rose Mt project could be used toward the Easement (up
  to \$8,000)
- Some of the earmarked money could also be used to create a trail head Kiosk. The kiosk could be
  used to present maps of the town trail and trails on Rose Mt. This would also provide an
  opportunity to identify this as a cooperative effort between the Town and PLC.
- If the town were to log the property in the future they could piggy back with PLC creating access and staging area to reduce cost/ increase profitability of the small lot.

33 Kurt contacted the PLC and requested that they include the ROW language as part of the easement 34 document. PLC indicated that it would take a few weeks to draft and should have by end of year or early 35 2020. 36 37 Greg asked if we want to add language for structures, trail access, building new trails and trail 38 maintenance, or a trail recreation plan. We decided to wait for the language provided by the PLC and 39 then address these topics. 40 **Wetland Ordinance** 41 42 Sharon motioned to draft a letter to the Selectman outlining our past discussions with them including 43 the report from the NRPC facilitated meeting on wetland protection options, to seek their guidance on 44 implementing and enforcement of the buffers, Theresa seconded, all in favor. 45 Asphalt plant 46 The plant owner is appealing to the Wilton planning board and there are no details yet on the next 47 steps. Sharon motioned that the letter of concern sent to the Wilton Zoning Board (ZBA) should also be 48 sent to the Wilton Planning Board prior to the appeal hearing, Greg seconded, all in favor. 49 50 Other business 51 Greg presented a proposed layout and language for the trail head signs at the Town Forest entrance. 52 Kurt Motioned to approve the language and layout, Theresa seconded, all in favor. Greg will forward to 53 Kris Henry to create the image file for manufacture. 54 There was a discussion about creating additional metal signs with trail maps on them for Purgatory Falls 55 and for the Town Forest. The town forest may have a kiosk so map could be presented there. In 56 addition, a mailbox could be attached to the kiosk with printed trail maps. A sign should be added on 57 mailbox encouraging people to replace the map after use to reduce the need/cost to print new maps. 58 59 Will the LCC support the petition for Carbon Cash Back? Need to do more research on impact, pros/cons 60 before establishing a platform. This will most likely not take place before the petition deadline and if 61 individuals want to support they can sign independently. 62 63 Adjourned: 7:52
