Old and/or Ongoing Business (Projects)

- 1.) Con Com Meeting scheduled for 06/09/22 not held due to lack of quorum
- 2.) Bob Howe emphasized that the state has no wetland buffer and the importance of the town to construct language to protect our water bodies. The con com is currently waiting on draft language proposed by the planning board.
- 3.) Commission and Selectmen members walked a property in the village district to evaluate how various wetland setbacks could potentially affect landowners, this insight will be helpful in determining a setback for the town or by district.

New Business

- 1.) Michael Kady, the President of the Pinnacle Mountain Fish and Game, inquired about the club maintaining use of the area adjacent to Putnam Pond for archery purposes and noted that this area has been posted with warnings that this area is used as a range. Theresa asked who is the current owner of this property, Lyndeborough or the State, and that we will need to understand ownership before providing guidance.
 - a. John Pomer asked what is the longest an arrow can go unobstructed? Michael, stated that a compound bow (70lbs) can travel 200 yards.
