Treasurer's report: Balance on Sept. 30, \$2838.06
Minutes of Sept. 21 were approved by consensus.

SHOW AND TELL

Jessie displayed a piece of a clay pipe, found under Citizens' Hall by workmen doing mold mitigation. Russ passed it to the Historical Society and it will be stored at the library.

PROPOSED 2019 BUDGET

The budget remains the same as last year, \$1050, with the "Old House Project" line renamed "Town History Project." It was approved by consensus. The Old House Project is on-going the history progresses slowly.

GIFT FROM QUILTING GROUP

The group regularly uses the Town Hall. Member Sally Curran spoke to Clayton about a thanks gift and suggested removable screens. Russ said the selectmen can accept the gift at a regular meeting and they would be delighted with screens. Clayton will talk with Sally and make the arrangements.

STAGE FLOOR UPDATE

The Center Hall stage was stripped of its gray linoleum, sanded, and the first coat of polyurethane applied on Oct. 31. Thompsons are doing the work. Clayton said, "something has to be done to keep the chairs from being stacked on it." Jessie will mention it to Russ.
Jessie had a picture of the old pine floor, finally revealed and gleaming. The Hall will be closed for the winter after Veterans' Day.

WOODWARD MONUMENT SIGN

The sign has been received and Stephanie has painted the post. Road Agent Mark Chase has said it will be in placed “before the ground freezes.” The sign will be placed behind the chain fence to the left of the monument.

CLARK POTTERY SIGN

Word has been received from the sign painter that the sign has been completed and will be shipped. Stephanie will get the two needed posts. Whether it is set this fall will depend on weather and schedules.

COMMON

The new electric service box has been installed by Jasper Electric. It is located near the Christmas tree behind the World War I monument and is inconspicuous. The workmen were careful in their trench digging for the wires. The light for the flag was also repaired. When a car hit the pole on the edge of the Common, the electric box was dislodged. Otherwise, the common is set for winter.

CENTER FLAGPOLE

A complaint was received that the light is “inconsistent.” The selectmen will have it looked at.

FLAGPOLE AT JOHNSON’S CORNER CEMETERY

The long-planned flagpole was installed the first week of September, to the right on the entrance.

OTHER BUSINESS

There was none. The next meeting was tentatively set for January 18, 2019 at the library.
